Now, more often than ever, acupuncture in North America is being used in the field of veterinary medicine on animals of all shapes and sizes, mostly for pain control.

Dr. Beckett has been practicing veterinary medicine in Glastonbury for over 25 years now. Today, many of his patients are those coming to see him for this form of holistic treatment. His patients range anywhere from cats and dogs to horses or llamas. Acupuncture is considered a complimentary therapy for a plethora of conditions from kidney disease to orthopedic injuries.

First created by the ancient Chinese over 3500 years ago, the concept behind this form of scientific art is that by inserting very fine, thin needles

into specific body points, one is able to target specific body organs & medical conditions. These "points" that are stimulated represent the meridians in which the energy of life flows. The physical stimulation of the acupuncture points stimulates the nerves, encouraging the proper function of the nerves, which regulates all body processes.

Typically, when the patients' presenting condition is appropriate for the use of acupuncture, treatments will last anywhere from 1 minute to 30 minutes. There are also varying types of acupuncture that can be used on the patient. At times, a form of acupuncture referred to as aqua puncture is called upon for treatment. This involves injecting homeopathic remedies, along with vitamin B12, into the specific points on the body. Another form of acupuncture involves using electricity (electro-acupuncture). Treatments are typically done weekly for 4 consecutive weeks. At this point, the patients' progress will be reviewed & a treatment plan will be put into place.
