Dental Month

Is your pet's breath too bad to accept a kiss? Maybe it's time for a dental prophylaxis!



Start the year off right by doing you and your pet a favor. Having your pet's teeth cleaned regularly reduces their risk of getting secondary infections. Think about how your mouth would feel if you didn't brush for 6 months. February is dental month and you will receive 10% off your entire bill, plus your pet will go home with a free toothbrush kit!

What is a dental prophylaxis you ask? Well, the veterinarian may have recommended one to your pet while it was in for their yearly check-up. After making an appointment, your pet should check in at 7:30 in the morning and will go home later that evening. A pre-anesthetic profile is recommended for dentals and for any patient undergoing a surgical procedure, involving anesthesia. A full scaling of the teeth is done to remove the bacteria-filled tartar and plaque. This will eventually solve the problem of your pet's gingivitis. Followed by the scaling, polishing and fluoride is applied. Your pet's teeth will be charted as human teeth are at the dentist and can be referred back to at your pet's next dental prophylaxis.
